MAYOR LANDRIEU WELCOMES NEW DONATIONS TO NORD FOUNDATION

NEW ORLEANS, LA-- Mayor Mitch Landrieu today unveiled new private donations to the New Orleans Recreation Development Foundation, the fundraising arm of the New Orleans Recreation Development Commission. Grant Capital Management donated \$100,000, while Veolia Water and Chevron donated \$25,000 each.

"Our best tool to improve our economy and reduce crime is investing in activities for our youth which is why we doubled funding for recreation in 2011 and have completely revamped the summer jobs program," said Mayor Landrieu. "The donations by these three companies will be leveraged to provide new opportunities for kids across our city and represent a solid investment for our future."

In October 2010, an overwhelming majority of voters (74%) approved a City Charter amendment creating the New Orleans Recreation Development Commission. The primary goals of the 13-member public-private partnership include creating a sustainable, permanent governance structure; providing governance that includes key stakeholders from the private sector, schools, and city government; and, creating a structure to allow the recreation department to leverage city resources with private funds, grants, and other funding opportunities.

"Grant Capital believes in giving back to the communities in which it conducts business," said Paul Beckham, COO of Grant Capital Management. "We participate in projects, programs and initiatives aimed at helping citizens most in need. We are pleased to support the New Orleans Recreation Department's efforts to provide community-based recreation programs and summer camps for New Orleans' young people."

"Veolia Water in keeping with its best practices and community involvement initiatives is donating \$25,000 to the New Orleans Recreation Department Foundation," said Kevin Servat, Senior Project Manager at Veolia Water. We look forward to continuing to be a part of the growth of the great City of New Orleans."

In December 2010, Mayor Landrieu announced significant new funding the City received for recreation programs from the NOTX trail derailment settlement fund totaling \$1.27 million.

"We have the leadership, vital new programming, and public and private investment in place to enhance recreational opportunities for all children.
